

To ensure the sealing mount tape adheres properly, make sure the temperature of the cleaned surface is at least 50°F and will remain so for at least a day.





### INSTRUCTIONS


It's very important that all sealing areas be both dry and absolutely free of dirt, oil, or any other contaminants prior to application of the Bulkhead Prep Kit.




- At the bulkhead, clean the top of the bulkhead and empty space underneath the bed rails thoroughly with a clean, lint-free cloth using Isopropyl Alcohol. Allow to dry.
- Begin by cutting the sealant tape in half. Place one half aside for now, you will need it for Step 6. This will leave you enough material to do both sides of the truck.












## **INSTRUCTIONS (CONTINUED)**

- Now take the remaining portion from the first half of sealant tape and fill the area underneath the bed rail cap shown in Figure 3 until you can no longer see any visible light shining through.
  - The sealant tape will remain pliable and can be reworked as necessary in the future.
- 6 Repeat these steps on the driver side of the truck.
- Install included bulkhead weatherstrip, it should be cut so that it overlaps the sealant tape and butts up against the inside edges of the plastic bedrail caps (Figures 4 & 5). Ensure it is aligned properly with perimeter weatherstrip of the cab panel.



- Never stretch the weatherstrip when applying. If you do, its adhesive will fail.
- Press down firmly with your thumb on the weatherstrip along its entire length.





- With the truck in a well-lit area or a second person shining a light from the outside corners of the bulkhead, verify that you cannot see light. If light is visible, reposition the sealing tape until no light is visible. This will give the best protection against the elements.
  - The bulkhead weatherstrip will stick to a spray-in bed liner just fine.
- After you have installed your cover, leave its front panel(s) closed and locked for 24 hours to allow the bulkhead weatherstrip adhesive, which is pressure-activated, to fully cure.
  - The sealant tape will remain pliable even after curing.
