


This truck requires a **Bulkhead Prep Kit** to be installed prior to cover installation. Please refer to the instructions in guide BH-5 prior to installation. Affix the included bed rail shims first and reference their included instructions.


Due to differences in tailgate designs, we recommend an application of automotive silicone spray on the tail panel weatherstrip. This will promote smoother operation and help avoid wear and tear.


PREPARE CARGO BED & INSTALL COVER

Remove the plastic cap from the tailgate end of the driver-side track by pressing its tab. Plastic cap will not be reused with your cover installed.



Holding mid and tail panels tightly together, begin unfolding towards tailgate.



Unfold tail panel towards tailgate.

Do not lift directly upwards at the hinge area as it can result in damage to the gutter and guides.




Carefully unfold the cover towards the tailgate by applying force at the

double-hinge area and allowing gravity to assist with unfolding.


Repeat steps 1-3 on the passenger-side.






Note strap orientation for use when refolding. Then remove straps to allow cover to unfold.



Position the cover so that it lands at the point where the bulkhead bracket and bedrail cap meet.




Position the cap clamps under the cab panel. Place one as close to the cab as possible (1) and the other against the stud closest to the tailgate end (2). Once all four clamps (2 per side) are positioned accordingly, uniformly tighten using a torque wrench and 9/16" socket to 50 in-lbs.

While tightening clamps, be aware of possible bed rail cap deformation. Overtightening clamps will damage bed rail caps and cause leaking.

The bottom halves of the cap clamps should be in the tracks.


Do not fold the cover until the clamps are tight.


Retighten after a week of use. Check them every time you haul on top.



PREPARE CARGO BED & INSTALL COVER (CONTINUED)

- Release the handle from the track and position clamp jaw under the striker bracket to begin engaging.
- Thoroughly compress the weatherstrip by applying a significant amount of downward pressure to the tail panel and engage the clamp. The clamp tension should be firm enough to clamp the cover securely to the bed rail with one hand. Adjust the tension by rotating the handle clockwise to tighten, and counter clockwise to loosen.





Leave the cover closed and clamped for 24 hours to allow the pressure-sensitive weatherstrip adhesive to fully cure.

TO FOLD COVER:

STEP 1

Release clamp and flip handle up, ensuring it locks in place (flush with panel).






BED RAIL

STRIKER BRACKET 0

CLAMP TO STRIKER BRACKET

Lift tail panel and fold to mid panel. While holding tightly together, fold on to cab panel.




FLIP HANDLE DOWN


Apply force towards the tailgate at the double-hinge area when folding and unfolding the mid panel. Do not lift directly upwards at the hinge area. Let gravity assist in folding/unfolding.

STEP 2


Secure cover with included straps before driving in the open position.




Feed straps underneath anchor plates.



Route strap accordingly



Ensure strap is properly inserted through buckle (with latch facing up).



Pull strap tight and make sure buckle is securely engaged.



Do not operate vehicle without securing the folded cover.
